Chapel West welcomes the new vegan pub The Cannon, which officially opened July 7.

Founded by Kevin MacKenzie, Skyller Melton, and Tessa Davis, the pub is named for the symbol of London's Arsenal Football Club, a cannon. It offers a menu of vegan and vegetarian options, beer, wine, and spirits. The restaurant's opening comes during time of renewal and recovery for eatery businesses in the district, having seen a number of closures during the pandemic. The pub is located at 135 Dwight Street, just in from Chapel Street.
